# Chicago Public Schools Culture of Calm Initiative



- Identify the High Schools at greatest risk for violence
- Create a safe school environment
- Collaborative approach to discipline, including evaluation/treatment for mental health issues
  - CPD CIT
  - CPS Crisis Unit
- Train school administration & staff on mental health issues
- Explore treatment alternative options first to address discipline issues
- Increase graduation rates/decrease expulsion rates
- Expand afterschool options and safe transport to and from school for extra-curricular activities
